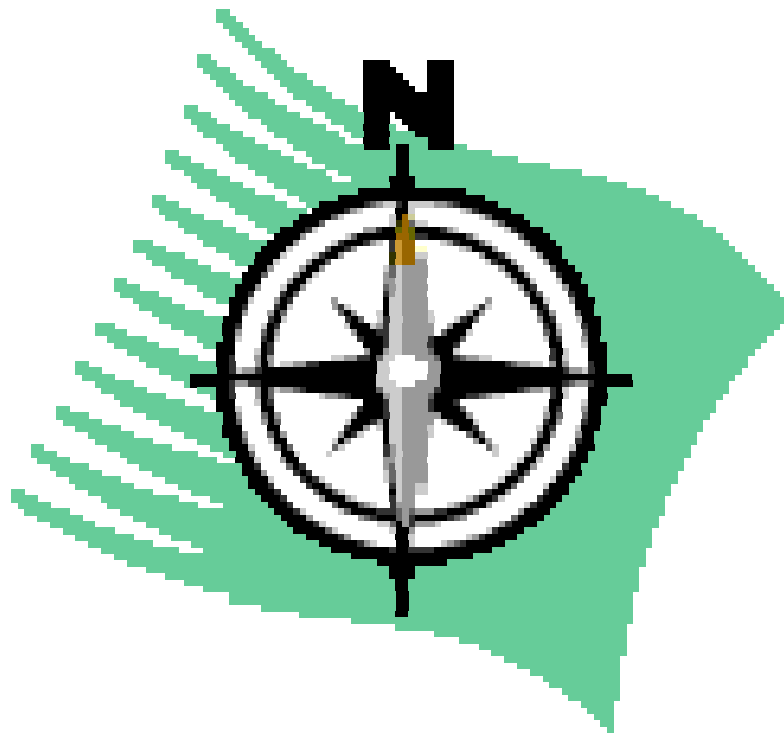

Directions

Appleton Farms is located off Route 1A (County Road) in Ipswich. The property is on the right side as you travel south on Route 1A. Our entry, however, will be off of Waldingfield Road, which is on the north side of the property. Signs will be posted at the end of Waldingfield Road at Route 1A and at the entrance to the camping area.

Check-in

All units must check in upon arrival. All units must submit a roster of all participants. Please, no arrivals before 5:00 PM.

Parking

Parking will be not allowed in camping areas, but there will be parking adjacent to the camping area. Please keep the amount of vehicles that you bring to a minimum.

For each vehicle, units will be given a form on which will show their unit number on and are asked to put this form on the dashboard of each vehicle. This will aid event staff in contacting the driver should the car need to be moved or any other problem arises.

Camping Areas

Camping areas will not be assigned. However, there will be designated camping areas. Some areas will be reserved for program.



Unit Campfires

There is wood that can be used for fires, but units are asked to bring some with them. All units must bring buckets for use as fire buckets. Campfires must be off the ground – no on-ground fires.

Drinking/Cooking Water



Please bring an initial amount of clean water with you. There is no clean water on site. We will make a couple of water runs during Saturday. There are two streams along the property where units can fill buckets for fire water.

Trash

Units are required to take all trash out of camp with them.

Bugs and Plants



Units should prepare their Scouts for proper protection against ticks and mosquitoes. This is a conservation area with fields and woods and both insects are present. Also, prepare everyone to be observant for Poison Ivy.

Program

Orienteering and Geocaching events will be the program for the day. Scouts will have the opportunity to learn or review information needed for Second Class and First Class map & compass and orienteering requirements. They will also have the opportunity to learn about geocaching and to take part in geocaching on the property.



Units should bring compasses with them for the program. Anyone who wishes to bring and use their own GPS units are asked to contact a member of the Activities Committee. We would like to have the GPS units in advance of the event so that they can be pre-loaded with the GPS points. The committee can be emailed at lonetreeactivities@comcast.net.

Fruit Cooking Competition

Units are encouraged to enter into our fruit cooking competition. Entries should be dishes using fruit prepared by and submitted by the Scouts. Each entry should be accompanied by a list of ingredients. Entries should be brought to camporee headquarters at 6:30 PM.

Saturday Night Campfire



Troop 13 of Ipswich will serve as the camporee host troop including setting up and emceeding the Saturday night campfire. Units should inform Troop 13 of the skit or song that they plan to perform at the campfire.

Webelos

Due to the logistics of this program, Webelos will not be able to take direct part in the program. They may follow patrols around and observe, if they wish.
